

The RescueGroups.org Website Service includes built-in features designed with animal welfare organizations needs in mind.

In this walk-through, we'll briefly go over some of the features unique to the RescueGroups.org Website Service, and how these features can help your organization.

With RescueGroups.org, you don't have to be completely dependent on your web person.

This may be one of the biggest benefits for your organization.

Organizations often find themselves stuck or feeling abandoned when their web savvy volunteer leaves. That person may have been the only one who knew how everything worked. That organization is then faced with questions on how to post the animals, how to pull the animals from the site when adopted, or how to post events. The organization may eventually be able to find a way to do this themselves, or they may not have the software, knowledge or access to do this.

Perhaps in your organization, you're the point web person and you're burning out. Maybe you just don't have the time you once did to keep up with everything and you really need a better way to allow volunteers to assist, without giving them access to everything or worrying they will make a mess of the site HTML.

The RescueGroups.org Website Service has many built-in features designed to make maintaining a website easier for animal welfare organizations.

The Website Service includes the Pet Adoption Portal, the Data Management Service, and Online Forms Service.

Automatically Generated Animal Web Pages

You don't need to manually create a web page for puppies, a web page dogs, a web page for seniors, or a web page for special needs animals. These are built in groups known as Special Lists. You can enable the ones you want to use, select a few options, and your animals will automatically be added to those web pages. Here is a list of these built-in groups:












Built-in Web Pages


Every website comes with built-in pages like About Us, Donation Information, Adoption Information, Contact Information, and more. You don't have to use them, but they're there to help get you started.



Built-in Website Menu


To get you started, we provide you with a menu that includes a list of links to built-in pages on your new website. Can you customize it? Of course!

He was fine until one day when he didn't eat dinner, then the next day started having labored breathing and X-rays revealed how compromised his lungs had become. Mr. Tux was humanely and peacefully put to sleep. He was on the SJACC Needs Rescue List a year ago and 13th St Cats stepped up to help him. Because of our foster homes and all our supporters, Mr. Tux was able to

have another year of quality life; no other rescue group was willing to take the chance on a faint positive FELV cat, but 13th St Cats did, and our lives are the richer for it. He will be missed. 5/1/12-2/24/14



Pip

Pip was a wonderful little Maine Coon tuxedo kitty who fell victim to urethane sensitization when his foster home replaced their floors and didn't tell us. They were mislead to believe all materials were safe to use around animals. The MSDS showed otherwise and, more importantly, little animals can't tolerate as much as big animals and he and his sister both got sensitized to it. On their second exposure (returning to home after a petfair) both little kittles had allergic reactions of the GI tract, having

repeated vomiting and pooping over and over in the course of a couple hours. Both were pulled out of the home, of course. Pip's big sister was able to survive the situation. Little Pip wasn't and died after we tried extensive allergy and anti-vomit meds to get him through it; but it was too much for his little body. Pip was a joy to be around, because even though he wasn't so well he still loved people and to be a part of a family. I can still see him at the top of the stairs looking down at me. We are so sad he couldn't be saved. Please always ask to see an MSDS for any new material you or your pets may be exposed to; it's your right. RIP 5/10/13-8/12/13

This feature allows you to show all of your animals that have been adopted. This is great for organizations who may not want to manually add stories using the Stories feature, or you can use both!









Animal Sponsorship's using PayPal Integration

You can enable this feature to easily allow visitors to sponsor specific animals. They can do a one-time or recurring sponsorship*. When you log in to your organization's PayPal account, you will see the animal name in the sponsorship.

*Your organization must have a merchant account with PayPal to use the recurring donation feature.



News Feature

There's no need to create and manually maintain a separate webpage for news. Enter them in your service and they will appear on your News page. You can also choose to have the news articles appear on your homepage or elsewhere, using a snippet. More on snippets later. It's very easy to maintain and there's no web page html to edit or update.



Events Feature with Integrated Animal Event Attendance

Like the News feature, the Events page is built in and automatically generated. There is both a calendar view and event list view. You can also show the events on your home page or elsewhere, using a snippet.

There's even an easy way to specify which animals will be at an event. This is great for adoption fairs!






